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Keys to Achieving Life's Goals

During the graduation season, high school and college graduates receive well-deserved praise and words of wisdom that they can successfully use as tools as they continue their life's journey. I, too, convey my congratulations to all graduates for a job well done.

This fall, many young people will begin their first semester or quarter in a four-year university, a community college or a business or vocational school. This transition is an exciting time for young people, and a critical period of their lives because decisions made at this point often determine a path their lives may take.

Recently, during the broadcast of the National Urban League's State of Black America on TV One

hosted by political commentator Rowland Martin, Symone Sanders, a communications consultant, political strategist and former national press secretary for Sen. Bernie Sanders, explained during the education segment why she believes that education is no longer a guarantee of success for young African-Americans.

She said, "Education is no longer the great equalizer because there are young people like myself who went to a really good school, paid a lot of good money, came out, and we could not find jobs. So, no longer can we continue to tell our kids 'You put your head down, you buckle down, you do your work, you go to school, you'll be able to get a good job, and your life will be successful.'" She believes we need to encourage more entrepreneurship and technical skills.

But you need some form of education to experience success in these areas too. I understand Sanders' sentiments. A few years ago, I went on a business tour and was impressed with the company's state-of-the-art, automated storage and retrieval system. Robots whizzing around the warehouse nonstop and performing assigned tasks would make any company proud. The problem was, I noticed few employees.

Many positions that propelled working-class Americans into middle-class status were replaced with computer technology. Other jobs never returned. Also, most private-sector jobs created have been for low-skilled and low salary positions. Various careers will require high-tech skills. Moreover, young people are competing against more applicants. So, what should we tell our young people?

For one, getting an education is so much more than just getting a job. Any education goal requires goal setting, discipline, time management, critical thinking and decision-making skills, including self-reflection — all of which become necessary whether an employee or a business owner. Other attributes must also be developed, alongside education.

Recently, I listened to a speech delivered by the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in 1967 to middle

school students. His speech, "What is your Life's Blueprint?" discussed points he believed are foundational to young people accomplishing their goals. First, he said, young people must base their life's blueprint on a deep belief in their dignity, worth, and value. They must never be ashamed of their ethnicity or biological features, nor allow anybody to make them feel unimportant.

Second, their life's blueprint must include a determination to achieve excellence in whatever field they pursue. They should be prepared and ready to enter doors of opportunity when they open and should never quit school, although Dr. King said he understood all the sociological reasons why they would. Nevertheless, he told the students that the greatest challenge they would face is being unprepared when the opportunities come.

Third, when they discover their career interest, they should commit to performing their task with excellence. He used as an example if they sweep streets, do so like Michelangelo painted pictures. He also told the students not to allow anyone to pull them down to hate or cause them to lose their self-respect. Dr. King urged the students to join in the struggle for justice and to help make the nation a better nation. It is their responsibility.

Each time Sanders, whom I mentioned earlier, filled out a job application, she could include her education and experiences she acquired.

She now graces popular magazine covers and participates in debates with other astute political commentators. The twenty-something seems to exude the qualities that Dr. King suggested.

Dr. King never said to the students that their dreams would materialize on their timetable. He concluded his speech with a poem written by author Langston Hughes titled "Mother to Son." One of the lines reads: "Don't you set down on the steps. 'Cause you finds it's kinder hard. I'se still climbin'. And life for me ain't been no crystal stair."

Health Talk

Dental Decay...Can Cause Pain or Death



How do you know when you have a cavity?

Well, I am happy you asked! Usually a patient will know they have a cavity when it hurts or they can see the black or brown stain on the tooth (late stage). A dental professional can tell if you have a cavity in the early stage. This diagnosis can be made from the x rays and a dental exam. A cavity is an infection in the tooth.

How is the cavity formed?

If you were to ask ten people what causes a cavity, 8 out of 10 would respond and say; "Candy". The truth of the matter is that candy doesn't cause cavities. Yes, you read that correct, candy doesn't cause cavities. To form a cavity you need three things; (1) the bacteria, (2) saliva and (3) a carbohydrate. There are many bacteria's in the mouth that causes cavities but the main one is *Streptococcus mutans*. A carbohydrate is a form of sugar; sugar from the foods we eat once broken down (bread, pasta, sweets, salad dressing and so on). When the three elements come together and the PH of the mouth drops to a low PH, the bacteria become active. The bacteria eat the sugar then produces acids that eat away at the enamel of the tooth. This process goes on for about 20 minutes until the PH of mouth returns to a neutral state. The cause of the cavity is from the bacteria, the *Streptococcus mutans*. If no bacteria, no cavities. We are not born with these bacteria; we get

the bacteria from sharing with others who have it. It is so important not to share with newborns, infants and children. For this situation, sharing is NOT caring when you share spoons, food, cups and so on. The bacteria are transmissible- kissing is a way to also get the bacteria. Remember in the perfect environment the bacteria can live.

How do you treat the infection?

A cavity is an infection in the tooth that spreads easily; no different than an infection you can get on your body. This infection if left untreated can be very harmful- even cause death. There are different levels of decay; listed below are some of the outcomes or treatments. (Please see photos)

**Incipient decay- early decay, reversible with improved oral health care (brushing, flossing, mouthwash).

**Moderate decay- requires a filling or crown.

**Severe decay- may require filling, crown, root canal or extraction.

**If no treatment is done at all, you are at risk for an abscess which could lead to going into the hospital for antibiotics or possible death. The infection can spread to the lymph nodes in the neck and blood stream then to the brain or chest.

Please take the time to read the article on the young man age 26 who recently died from an untreated cavity; google Vadim Anatoliyevich. This can happen to anyone.



What do you need to do: to save your teeth and stay healthy regarding your oral health?

1. Have a dental cleaning and exam done every six months.

2. Don't share with others, especially with someone with poor oral health (pretty smiles don't mean good oral health).
3. Brush and floss 2-3 times a day and use an anticavity mouthwash.
4. Use Xylitol products: when the bacteria eats this form of sugar it can't grow.
5. Drink water after eating, snacking or having a sugary drink.

4. Go to a local Dentist, average price for the exam is \$40 and for the cleaning \$100.

Conclusion

Dental visits can be expensive. They become expensive when you don't have regular checkups. We take our car in for oil changes and tune ups to make sure the engine doesn't go out. Why don't we go to the dentist for checkup and cleanings to make sure our teeth don't fall out? Dentures and implants are very expensive and can never take the place of your real teeth. Stop believing that teeth go bad as we age or a dental cleaning cost like \$1000, so you can't go. Teeth are priceless, and we only get one adult set, take care of them.






