Financial Assistance Programs & Resources in the Bay Area

Here are some programs and tips for finding financial help:

1. 211 / County Human Services / Social Services Departments

Call **211** (or local county number) to be referred to emergency financial assistance (rent help, utility help, cash aid) in your area.

2. CalWORKs / TANF / SSI / SSDI / General Assistance

Each county's social services or human services department often administers these welfare / cash aid programs for low-income residents.

3. Utility Assistance Programs

- Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
- Local utilities often have discount or hardship programs (PG&E, municipal water, etc.)

4. Nonprofit / Charity Aid

Many religious and nonprofit organizations provide one-time aid for rent, groceries, prescription meds, and bills. Ask local churches, community centers, and social service agencies.

5. Health Insurance Enrollment / Medi-Cal

Use Covered California or local health clinics to see if someone qualifies for Medi-Cal (which covers many services including medical, and in many counties, dental). Some of the free clinics above assist with enrollment.

For dental, California's Medi-Cal dental program (Denti-Cal) covers dental for eligible members.
